Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college procured lift, solar panel, fire extinguisher, safe drinking water facility, LED bulbs and CCTV surveillance for security in the college campus. The college has seen a considerable growth in infrastructure commensurate with the academic developments that have taken place over the past few years. The number of classrooms increased while the existing ones have been upgraded with new, improved technology. Two multimedia halls with LCD projectors along with one seminar hall with LCD projectors and smart board and one open air auditorium to organize academic, cultural and co-curricular events. Almost all the classrooms are connected with Wi-Fi facilities. There are two advanced mike system with two collar mike, six floor mikes, three hands-free mikes and eight podiums. The college has two photocopy units providing services to the students at subsidized rates. Consequently, the demand for greater supply of electricity has led to the installation of 40 KVA solar power panels to generate electricity from renewable energy source which reduces environmental pollution.

The well-managed and spacious college library is there to support the students with INFLIB Net and N-LIST facilities along with SOUL 2.0 library software. All the books are bar-coded and have issue and receiving slips. It is Wi-Fi enabled and has a seating capacity of 100 users at a time. The library has extravagant number of books, journals well maintained reference section and book bank. Curriculum Laboratory, Psychology lab, physical science lab and computer labs have undergone effective modernization of instruments and equipments for current requirements of the students.

The increased demand for basic requirements like clean and hygienic toilets with sufficient water supply, toilets for disabled, Sanitary pad vending machines, separate toilets for teachers and students along with canteen, pantry and water filters on every floor. These are maintained by effervescent maintenance officer to enshrine glitch free ambience to the staff and students of the college for enhancement of teaching learning experience.

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Response:

The college is dedicated to cater the academic and practical needs of the students to synchronize internship along with add-on and certificate courses to enhance experiential learning. One of the most effective student centric collaborative systems is functioning in the institution that bridges the gap between the student and teaching community through effective reverberation of the experiential learning,

- Teachers amalgamated case study method and project work to imply participative learning in the classrooms.

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode

Response:

The College is a constituent College of the Barkatullah University, Bhopal and obliged to implement all directives of the University regarding continuous internal evaluation. These include the system of Internal Evaluation of teaching subjects on skill enhancement course, ability enhancement, compulsory course and internal assessment in all disciplines for all papers. During the lockdown following Covid-19 Pandemic, online questions for assignments were imparted to the students. It is worth reporting that despite the several problems that some of the students faced with regard to Wi-Fi or internet connection or not having laptops, the submission of assignments for internal evaluation before final examination was almost exhilaration. The College adheres to the factor of student attendance in all assessments, which serves as an incentive for regularity and academic discipline.

Mien of the college adheres for internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode

- The schedule for class tests and assignments are notified to the students in advance and uploaded on the respective departmental notice boards.
- The schedules announced are strictly adhered to.
- The Principal of the College monitors the effective implementation of the schedule. Each

department verifies the internal assessment data of the students before it is put for display for the students to check.

- Discrepancies or grievances of the students, if any, are assessed and resolved by departments before submission to the Principal of the College which is an interface between the College and the University.
- Internal Examination is conducted at end of the session based on University exam pattern at departmental level.
- Answer key and marking scheme are prepared by subject teachers before evaluation. Evaluation of assessment tests and assignments are executed by the respective subject teachers within two days from the exam and submission of assignments.
- Subject teachers can also conduct various academic activities like surprise test, objective type test and quiz for assessing the students' progress.
- Viva voce and mock tests are conducted with the current topics to give an exposure to the students of the various disciplines.
- Internal Assessment Data was uploaded on the University Portal and displayed on the notice boards of all the respective departments with proper regularity and efficiency. It was kept open for Student Grievances and Redressed.
- The College has a system of Student Feedback which facilitates effective implementation of evaluation processes.
- Ensuring transparency, the system of evaluation is effectively implemented. This can be judged on the basis of assignments, presentations, interactions, projects or oral tests etc.
- Teachers assign innovative projects to students to build and check their creative skills.
- Presentations are taken on the topics related to the syllabi or even on topics other than the main paper to develop the interest of students.

We can postulate that a continuous internal assessment system works throughout the session to evaluate the students on the basis of their daily performance and growth.

2.5.2 Mechanism to deal with internal/external examination related grievances is transparent, timebound and efficient

Response:

The Grievance and Redressal Meeting was held thrice in an academic session to enquire from the students if there were any Grievances and for this they replied in the negative. It was also informed in the meeting to come out with suggestions and issues if any and at any time during the working hours.

Yardsticks of the college for *grievances*

- The college is a constituent college of Barkatullah University and therefore it follows the guidelines set by the University for the conduct of examinations. At the end of each semester, there is a final exam which is uniformly conducted for all the students of all the colleges.
- Internal Assessment forms a part of a continuous evaluation system conducted through Class Tests, Tutorials, Assignments, Projects and Presentations. All of these together constitute an integral part

of Internal Examination which is carried out in a well-planned and systematic manner.

- The institution has a well-defined system in place to deal with examination related grievances. The College displays the marks of internal examination on the notice boards of all the departments where each student can view her total assessment marks at the end of each semester and can report discrepancies, if any, within a specified time period. The college forwards grievances of the students to the university regarding to examination related grievance.
- There is departmental committee at the college level that looks into any discrepancies in Internal Assessment marks and takes requisite steps to ensure transparency and objectivity. If any error is detected in the final mark-sheet in spite of rigorous scrutiny, it is promptly reported to the University by the College. Hence the College employs a robust multi-tiered mechanism to ensure transparency and objectivity in dealing with grievances related to internal examinations.

In the beginning of each session after the admission process is over, each department is required to assign a teacher mentor to each student of first year. It is also required that the same mentor continues to be with the ward for whole span of education in the college.

• The college is very particular for adequate Mentor-Mentee ratio to enhance the success ratio of the students. Mentors conduct a meeting with their mentees once a month to discuss their problems and issues. These issues can be related to college infrastructure, academic, nonacademic or personal as well.

2.6.2 Attainment of programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution.

Response:

The college has an effervescent mechanism to take a note of the progress of the students and identify their specific learning needs to ensure that the stated objectives of the curriculum are achieved during the session.

o Class tests and class presentations are arranged so that weaker areas of the students are identified and special measures are taken plan their unitized syllabi in each semester.

o Students are assigned various topics for presentations, seminars and model making whereby they are assessed. Outcome of the efforts made by the institution is properly recorded by the college.

o Staff meetings at department level are regularly held to review the progress of the students and to ensure the timely completion of the syllabus so that a clear way is paved towards optimum learning outcomes.

Every year, our students bring laurels to the institute by winning trophies in various competition and Youth Festival. The college offers various programs with clearly defined outcomes. The college has a systematic process of collecting and evaluating data on program and course outcomes and uses them to overcome the barriers to learning.

1. The Institution has a well-defined mechanism, using online software to track and monitor the attainment levels for program outcome, course outcome and program specific outcome.

2. Preparation of the learning outcomes is done across all the Programs and Courses. The set program outcomes, course outcomes, and program specific outcomes are collected for different courses.

3. The IQAC and Departments heads regularly monitor the attainment level for every course. In case the attainment level of any course is below the thresh hold then additional measures such as remedial classes, tutorial classes, additional assignments etc are conducted.

4. The evaluation of attainment of PO, PSO and CO is primarily made on the basis of the performances of the students in summative and formative assessments in the courses.

5. Learning outcomes of the students are regularly monitored by the departments and appropriate remedial measures are taken for desired course outcomes.

The departments impart various activities to accomplish the objectives:

o To familiarize the students with their personality traits by conducting various co-curricular activities to enable them in selection of jobs or for higher studies.

o To enable the students to analyze the strengths and weakness of their personality.

o To provide psychological support to cope up with the challenges of future life.

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The Organizational Structure of the College consists of the Management, Governing body, the Principal, the teaching staff, the non-teaching staff and the students.

1. The Management of the College is the highest decision-making body which is in constant touch with the Principal on all matters pertaining to the smooth functioning of the institution. This is followed by the Governing Body of the College which meets at least thrice a year to discuss issues relating to finance, infrastructure, faculty recruitment and the matters related to the overall development of College.

2. The Principal is assisted by the teaching, non-teaching and supporting staff to oversee the smooth

3. 6.3 Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 The institution has effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff

Response:

The institution has effective welfare measures for teaching and non- teaching staff:-

Timely disbursement of salary is an important point of satisfaction for teaching and non teaching staff.

Leave Benefits (As per University rules)

13 days of casual leave are provided to both teaching and non-teaching staff. 10 medical leave can be availed by the permanent teaching staff on the basis of medical certificate. 12 academic leave are provided to attend various Orientation, Refresher, Seminar, workshops and Training Programs as per the Government rules.

All the faculty members provided with financial support to attend and presented papers in conferences and workshops.

Non-teaching staff is also given duty leave. Female teaching and non-teaching staff can avail a Maternity Leave of 90 days as per Government rules. Male teaching and non-teaching staff can avail Paternity Leave of 15 days. Study leave up to one month is provided to both teaching and non-teaching staff.

Retirement Benefits (As per the University Rules) GPF (General Provident Fund) which allows Pension to employees after superannuation.

Gratuity NPS (National Pension Scheme for employees who joined services after 01.01.2004) Loan Benefits Both the teaching and non-teaching staff can avail Loan facilities as per Government rules.

Quick Provident Fund Loan Facility – 100% of those who applied have availed the benefit.

Faculty Development Program: Faculty Enhancement programs for skill up-gradation and training are organized for both teaching and non-teaching staff.

Computer Training Courses: Computer Training Courses are provided for teachers to help them hone their e-skills and the nonteaching staff is sent to attend computer training courses.

Support Facilities Canteen, Grievance Redressal cell,Parking facilities for both teaching and non-teaching staff.

Clean drinking water facilities. Facilities such as lifts and ramps and other facilities for differently able students.

ICT Facilities: The College is fully Wi-Fi enabled. Two full-fledged Computer labs and a Psychology lab for research work for both students and faculty.

Research Facilities:-Staff members get the facilities for their research work like access to internet in computer lab, high level research material (INFLIB Net ,surveys, journals, online consultation of research material) and literature books by authors of national and international repute)

6.3.5 Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

Response:

Performance appraisal system of the staff includes the following mechanisms:

- Students' feedback
- Parents and alumni feedback
- Self-appraisal report

The college is putting tireless efforts to maintain Performance Appraisal System for teaching and nonteaching staff. The institution right from its inception has maintained a transparent and democratic system of Performance Appraisal. A proper constitution has been developed by the founders. The managing trust is working for the noble cause of education. No trust member is getting any salary or honorarium. Performance of teachers is assessed by the Principal and Managing Trust of the college through annual confidential report.

Teaching faculties 'Appraisal

Self appraisal Performa is filled by the teachers and assessed by the Principal. The feedback is sought from the students on feedback performa for teacher's feedback forms.

- Teachers ensure that the students of the department fill the feedback questionnaire.
- The questionnaire is structured to elicit responses for parameters like communication skills, subject knowledge, discipline, work-ethics, and curriculum to provide effective mentoring along with career guidance to students and grade the teacher's ability in creating an interactive, discussion-oriented and democratic classroom.
- These forms are then evaluated and analyses all the reports and meets with teachers with constructive feedback and corrective measures.
- Teaching competencies of teachers are assessed by students' performance in university examinations and inter collegiate competitions.
- A suggestion box is provided. Principal can assess the performance of the teacher by observing his management skills in performing different duties and in fulfilling the responsibilities allocated to them by the Principal.
- The College requires that the teachers furnish a self-evaluation form every year provided by College office. This provides an insight into one's own assessment of effectiveness of the teaching style and its impact on the students.
- It highlights how the teacher handles different situations that affect the learning progress of the students. It also makes known the involvement of the teacher in both academic and administrative activities. Through this form teachers can showcase continuous professional development (paper presentations, publications, seminars and conferences attended) etc.
- Departments collate the data for appraisal of teaching-learning activities of teachers in the form of departmental reports which are then forwarded to the Principal.
- The IQAC of the college assesses the report submitted by the faculty and department and does an academic audit which is then shared with the departments.
- The performance appraisal is also used for Career Advancement of the teachers who are updated about their performance at each level. If there is a scope for improvement on the part of the teacher, they are advised to upgrade themselves. The whole system is carried out in confidential manner.

Non-Teaching Appraisal The College follows the performance appraisal procedures as per UGC norms. Each employee fills and submits the Annual Performance Appraisal Report. A constructive feedback is given to the employee so that they can further enhance their performance level and efficiency.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1 Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

Response:

The College has an extensive account audit process. A well-defined mechanism is in force for financial audit to have discipline and transparency in financial management of the institution. The accounts of the institution are subject to both internal and external audit of all financial activities The College conducts internal and external financial audits annually. The institution has a finance section in its administrative setup which maintains and audits the financial statements regularly. All the expenses made by the institute are audited by internal audit. The institute has specialized team under vigilance of principal who conducts the internal audit regularly. The internal audit is supervised by the principal and submitted to the certified Chartered Accountant. The college accounts department prepares an annual budget estimate in consultation with the Principal and the Principal in cohesion with Management Committee and Governing body. For major expenses, approval from Management Committee has to be taken.

FYardsticks of internal audit

- Internal audit is a continuous process which ensues after each and every financial transaction.
- In the initial stage, the office in-charge scrutinizes and verifies the financial data.
- This is again scrutinized by the Principal for clarity, authenticity, transparency and financial accuracy.
- The Institution is liberal, yet follows the strategy of restraint as far as the expenditure is concerned.
- Proper procedure for purchases is adopted. Quotations are called for and prices are compared.
- The Institution has formed a Purchase Committee for the purpose.
- The college periodically observes and inspects all the files pertaining to the financial matters of all the receipts and payments in the college.
- They, in turn, submit the audit report to the college authorities. Corrections are effected on the basis of the audit report and clarifications called by them are submitted as an audit reply.

The external Certified Charted Accountant audits the financial statements and submits to the institution the audited financial statements with audit reports in every financial year regularly. The audit reports are prepared annually. After a study of the report, the Governing Body instructs the concerned section to rectify the errors, if any, to set right the audit objections. The objections mentioned in the report are communicated to the concerned sections for immediate rectifications.

FYardsticks of External audit

• The external audit takes place annually after the completion of every financial year.

- The Chartered Accountant, who works as an auditor is appointed by the College.
- The program goes on for 8 to 15 days during the month of March. The bills and vouchers of the revenue expenditure are checked.
- The vouchers and proper record with the concerned Department of the capital expenditure is also checked and verified.
- . Statutory external audit and assessment of Income-Expenditure and Receipt-Payment is also accomplished.
- The audit objections or compliance, if any, is handled by the Accounts Department

- Only authorized persons by management can operate the transaction through the bank.
- The accounts are done by electronically so all the entries can be monitored by authorities.
- For each and every financial transaction proper permission is taken from the Principal of the College.
- The audited statements of income and expenditure are prepared by the auditors in the form of Utilization Certificate.
- The college accounts department prepares an annual budget estimate in consultation with the Principal before inception of the financial year.
- The Management Committee takes decision for expenditure on infrastructure.
- In order to meet expenses for construction, repair and renovation of the college building and premises, the college has no other resources than students' fee.
- Students' fee structure cannot be moderated due to un-avoided hazards like covid pandemics.
- The institute utilizes its resources in its optimal format.
- The college embark fund for various head and the best alternative is opted.

If additional expenses surpass the budget proposals, the governing body takes special measures.

FReform-1:Structured feedback and Review of learning outcomes

Feedback is regularly taken to facilitate the teaching-learning process. The IQAC designed a structured feedback form on teacher's performance, curriculum and infrastructure. Based on these feedbacks various innovative activities and reforms were introduced.

The IQAC is an advisory body and it offers suggestions for development of intellectual property, language skill, the teaching learning process and infrastructure along with many other fields related to the college. For proper improvement of academic standards and learning outcomes ,the IQAC monitors teaching and student performance.

- Feedback is a vital part of the teaching-learning process. The analysis of the effectiveness of teaching learning is made through the stakeholder's feedback mechanism.
- IQAC has developed well-structured feedback systems. It prepares various feedback forms and collects structured feedback on design and review of syllabus and student feedback on teachers.
- Principal, with the help of the IQAC members analyzes the feedback, discusses in the departmental meetings and prepares a consolidated report for further improvement and implementation.
- The collection and analysis of feedback from different stakeholder assist the institution to understand the need of students.
- Feedbacks regarding the teaching learning process help to identify the teaching pattern suitable for different types of learners available in the institution.
- Analysis of feedback emblazons added aspects in the teaching process help the slow learners to learn better and the advanced learners to grasp the subtle nuances of the matter taught.
- Learning outcomes are reviewed by IQAC in all the departments, based on the students' performance in tests conducted for continuous internal assessment along with responses in the classes and performance in the final or end semester examinations.
- The IQAC ensures regular attendance of students and teachers round the year for excellence in learning outcomes.
- The IQAC ensures that students' grasp over all areas of curriculum through periodical assessments along with experiential learning.
- Departments are encouraged to conduct tutorials, expert lectures and special classes regularly to address the specific needs of students.
- Provision of free access to add on and certificate courses for students to upgrade their skills during the lockdown period was initiated and succeeded in getting fruitful results.
- Provision for conducting remedial classes for slow learner
- Provision of Hardware and Software facilities to conduct the class work for 2020-21 academic years through online mode was initiated.

FReform-2:Enhancing Institutional Collaboration

IQAC has taken initiatives to organize capacious collaborative activities of the institutions with other ones. The IQAC regulates the arrangements for organizing seminars, workshops and expert lectures by individual departments and at college level to upgrade the knowledge base of the students.

IQAC worked continuously to amalgamate the Curriculum, Teaching, Learning Methodology and Evaluation Reforms by bringing the quality management system in all aspects of the academic activities and through curriculum review advisory committee (CRAC).

IQAC effectively implemented SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) for teaching through ICT platform both online and face to face Classroom as instrumented by M.P. higher education.

- Professional institutes rub shoulders with the college to update its IT facility and up gradation of internet speed for smooth functioning of the system..
- IQAC encourage faculty members and Students to participate in various Conferences and Seminars, Cultural Activities, Extracurricular Activities organized by collaborative institutions.
- IQAC cell continuously arrange the collaborative activities, faculty exchange and student exchange activities with other institutions.
- Capacity building and skill enhancement activities were organized online with institutions of national and international repute for taking care of covid 19 pandemic.

The college is very particular to take all the measures for pollution free ambience and in order to manage the waste effectively.

Solid Waste Management:

The principle of three R's which are Reduce, Reuse and Recycle are employed.

Reduce: The reduction in the use of raw materials.

Reuse: Reuse of waste materials and recycling of those.

Recycle: Recycling of materials.

- The first step is **Segregation of waste** at source collected from the grounds, rooms and canteen.
- Green and Blue bins: Awareness on segregation of wet and dry waste is created and blue and green dust bins along with compost bin are used.
- Throwing the waste anywhere is strictly prohibited. The dustbins are emptied in movable carrier which carries the waste to the **garbage dump** provided.
- Usage of plastic bags is discouraged within the premises of the College.
- Bio-degradable waste is allowed to degrade or decompose in oxygen rich medium in an advanced compost bin and non-biodegradable wastes are picked by Municipal Corporation on regular basis.
- Compost arrangements are also made to covert solid waste into fertilizer and manure that can be used for the purpose of gardening in the campus.

Liquid Waste Management: The college has commerce, Arts and Education departments so chemical waste is not part of liquid waste. The liquid water waste from the drinking water area is reusing for

watering the potted plants, irrigating the garden and flora of the Institute. The initiative facilitates maintaining lush green garden even in peak of summer.

E-Waste Management:

- The non functional computers, equipments and its peripherals are safely disposed.
- The cartridge of laser printer is refilled outside the college campus. UPS batteries are recharged / repaired/ exchanged by the suppliers.

The Context

- Most of our students belong to the conservative background where family members do not encourage girls to take up jobs especially when they need to work outside Bhopal. Hence, we have been conducting skill oriented and Income generating training and certificate programs to promote economic self-sufficiency among these students.
- Our college is keen in developing and promoting employment opportunities and entrepreneurship skill among girls' students.
- To spawn opportunities of part time jobs for accomplishment of the mission and objective of nurturing the students to be financially independent and economically prosper.
- Identified the locality of disadvantaged group of people to inculcate social responsibility among girls' students.
- Initiatives are taken from N.S.S. unit and the college to anticipate efforts for the improvements of the life of people of god basti.
- In line with this vision our college management took upon itself the mammoth task of empowering women through multi-spectral education without taking any financial benefit from government.
- Career guidance is also provided to facilitate economic security and financial independence of women. We help the girls to find their own footing, write their own story and fight their own battles after they move out from this institution.
- To inculcate entrepreneurial attitude among young girls they are encouraged to plan start-ups so that they become job givers instead of job seekers.

The practice:

Problems encountered and resource required:

? The college needs to introduce more vocational courses to equip the girls with skills to become financially independent.

? It was very difficult to motivate and assemble people of God Basti.

? People were not able to believe our intentions.

The first barrier in the way of efforts of college to foster women empowerment is ingrained in cultural norms. The girls feel the pressure as they have to swim against the system and socially constructed gender biases to enter the college. Our students have inculcated extraordinary set of skills and potential but they are not permitted by their parents to demonstrate their skills outside the campus so they are restricted only to the on-campus or online activities which are creating a bottleneck in earn and learn process.

Most of the girls discontinue their education after graduation and embrace matrimony. Parents still perceive marriage as priority over education. This dwindle the number of girl students in Post-Graduation. Many parents dislike their daughters going out in the job market to rub shoulders with business people. Conducting such training activities along with effervescent delivery of curriculum without compromising on academic excellence has always been a great challenge for the institution as it requires ever ongoing

adjustments in time table and curricular schedules

Many students find it very difficult to pay even very nominal fees for training activities due to their drastic financial condition. Hence, college conducts many activities free of cost resulting in deficits. Getting qualified technical resource persons from outside on account of financial constraints or lack of appropriate funding agency is also a factor retarding the growth and smooth conduct of such training activities in campus.

Title of the practice-2

"Environmental Consciousness and promotion of sustainable environment"

- To accomplish the goal the college implemented mechanisms by which wastes can be utilized for the production of compost and cater the need of fertilizer for the college garden.
- The greenery of the College campus is an oasis amid the neighboring commercial establishments and the traffic on the roads.
- Tapping the sunlight for generating solar energy is an important step towards reducing carbon footprints. The energy thus generated fulfils more than 75% energy requirements of the college along with contributing for national need.
- In order to sustain the clean and green environment of the college emblazons balance between utilization and transformation along with disposal of wastes has to be maintained.
- Waste papers and old news papers are purchase by certified recycler to be recycled.
- Good quantity of green waste is generated in the college premises which are effectively composted as manure in the compost pit installed at college premises.
- To develop a green corner for migratory and local birds' students and staff members are associated under the flag of Eco-club.
- The college campus comprises variety of plants like- plants with Medicinal values, Herbs, Shrubs and trees for equilibrium of flora and fauna.
- **'Sakore'** (earthen pots) with water were kept for birds at the different places of the college during summer.
- The College conducts green, energy and environment audit by the internal and external committee annually.

The Practice:

Anand Vihar College is steadfastly committed towards creating an eco-friendly and sustainable campus. Instilling the urgency of environmental conservation and environment sustainability is realized through the following practices:

- 1. Events and campaigns : The college regularly organizes various events and campaigns to spread environmental awareness:
- Regular plantation of plants and trees in the campus and beyond campus campaign.
- Campaigns for discouraging the use of polythene Several campaigns by Eco-Club and NSS for creating awareness through social media are conducted.
- Student volunteers interact with the public to generate consciousness among them about the responsible use of natural resources.
- 1. Maintaining a green campus and a medicinal plant corner:

- The College has a lush green vehicle-free campus with elaborated sports ground.
- Vehicle movement in the main campus is prohibited for pollution free ambience.
- The college has varieties of trees and plants in accordance with surrounding forest grassland area in harmony with the ecosystem of the area.
- A medicinal and green corner has been nurtured in the premises with varieties of species of medicinal plants to augment a healthy ambience in the college.

1. The Solar Power Plant

A 40 KWH solar-power plant was installed on the college rooftop and has been operational since 2018. Since the installation of this plant, the college has not only been saving expenditure on electricity but also effectively reducing the use of non-renewable resources.

- 1. **Compost Pit:** Compost Pit installed in the College converts green and food waste to humus which is used in the college garden.
- 2. **Rainwater harvesting**: The College has a rainwater harvesting system. It is a recharging point for collecting rainwater from rooftops and storm water generating from the premises. It is fitted with a filtration device (sand and gravel filter) to filter the rainwater.
- 3. Eco club: Eco club is a pro active association for enhancement of awareness among students towards environment.

Meeting is conducted on regular basis by the committee to decide activities of the club.

Eco club maintains green potted plants in corridors of every floor of the college.

Students brought some pots and decorated them for making 'Sakore' for birds.

A workshop was organized to plan and execute green compost by collecting garbage of campus conducted by Muskan Foundation (NGO).

1. Events and campaigns

The college regularly organizes various events and campaigns to spread environmental awareness:

- A campaign was organized with a tag line 'No Plastic only Paper Bags'.
- Regular competitions were organized during regular teaching and Youth Festival in which recycled material was used to spread the awareness.
- Students enthusiastically participate in paper bags distribution drive.
- Campaigns for encouraging the use of cloth-bag and paper bags instead of polythene.
- Several campaigns by Eco-Club and NSS for creating awareness through social media are conducted.
- Student volunteers interact with the public to generate consciousness among them about the responsible use of natural resources.

Evidence of Success:

Reduction of electricity bill

- The electricity bill of the college has considerably reduced after the successful operation of the rooftop solar power plant.
- Our students have received appreciation from the public during several campaigns and many people have promised to use the resources wisely and make all efforts to protect and conserve the environment.
- Value of awareness towards environment is developed among students.
- Students' behavior is changed towards environment and various activities were taken up by the Ecoclub for the conservation of environment.
- Greenery is maintained in campus due to regular activities conducted by Eco-club.
- Plant saplings are presented to the guests on the different occasions like national festivals and Magazine Release function.
